

# FATHER'S DAY FUN

Celebrate Father's Day on June 21st with these two quick and easy makes. Both are ideal for larger groups using basic materials. **ENCOURAGES:** Exploring & Using Mixed Media & Materials

## STORE CUPBOARD

- A4 sheet of pale blue card
- White & light green card
- Black paint & paper plate(s)
- Black felt-tip pen
- Green craft foam
- Scissors & glue stick
- Pencil & circular object to draw around

**1** To make a blank greetings card, fold an A4 sheet of thin, pale blue card in half vertically and put to one side.

**2** To make the football, draw round a small bowl onto a piece of thin white card and cut out. Ours had a diameter of approx. 11cm.

**3** Using the black felt-tip pen, draw rough pentagon shapes in the card circle. Put some black paint onto a paper plate and encourage the children to fill the pentagons with black fingerprints.

**4** The grass is made from a strip of green craft foam which has been snipped into using scissors.



**5** Using a glue stick, fix the football onto the centre of the card, then glue down the foam grass strip on top of the football.

**6** To complete the card, write a Happy Father's Day message onto pale green card and glue above the football.



## No. 1 DAD ROSETTE

### STORE CUPBOARD

- Coloured or plain paper plate
- Paints & brushes
- Coloured paper
- Patterned felt/paper
- Self-adhesive foam glitter stars
- Glue stick
- Sticky tape
- Pencil & felt-tip pens
- Circular object to draw around
- Scissors

**1** To make the base of your rosette you can either use a pre-coloured paper plate or paint a plain white one the colour of your choice.

**2** Draw around a circular object to make the centre of your rosette. Let the children write a message if they can or just draw on a design.

**3** Stick the message into the centre of the paper plate using a glue stick.

**4** Add decorations around the message. We've used self-adhesive foam glitter stars.

**5** To make the ribbons for your rosette, cut two wide lengths from patterned felt or paper and then snip a small triangle shape into two of the ends. Fix the 'ribbons' behind the paper plate using pieces of sticky tape.
