STORE CUPBOARD

- Glue
- Scissors
- Cardboard
- Paints
- Paintbrush
- Clothes pegs

To Make the Hippo

- 1 Draw around the Hippo templates onto card and cut them out.
- 2 Paint the body and face with grey paint. Glue the face onto the front. Add details with black paint and a thin paintbrush, or use a marker pen.
- 3 Glue two clothes pegs onto the back of the legs so that he stands up.

To Make the Lion

- 1 Draw around the lion templates onto card and cut them out.
- 2 Glue the legs onto the back of the mane, and glue the face onto the front. Paint the mane with reddish-brown paint, and the legs and face with a sandy yellow colour. Add details with black paint and a thin paintbrush, or use a marker pen.
- 3 Glue two clothes pegs onto the back of the lion's legs so that he stands up.

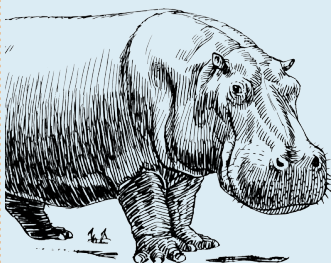
DID YOU KNOW?

To Make the Zebra

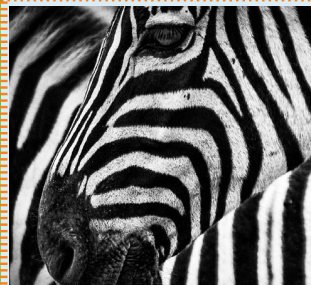
- 1 Draw around the Zebra templates onto card and cut them out.
- 2 Paint the body and face with white paint, then add a striped pattern around the edge of the body. We've alternated long and short black stripes. Glue the face onto the front. Add details with black paint and a thin paintbrush, or use a marker pen.
- 3 Glue two clothes pegs onto the back of the legs so that he stands up.



DID YOU KNOW?
